

Simon Savšek je leta 2009 z odliko diplomiral na Ekonomski fakulteti v Ljubljani. Po končanem magistrskem študiju ekonomije na Evropskem univerzitetnem inštitutu v Firencah, se je kot ekonomist zaposlil v analitsko-raziskovalnem oddelku Banke Slovenije in se hkrati vpisal na doktorski program ekonomije na Ekonomski fakulteti, kjer je leta 2019 tudi doktoriral. Leta 2014 je začel delovati v Evropski centralni banki, od novembra 2017 pa je zaposlen na Evropski investicijski banki kjer vodi Predstavništvo Skupine EIB v Sloveniji.

Njegova bibliografija obsega izvirne znanstvene prispevke, tako v domačih kot tudi mednarodno- uveljavljenih revijah s področja ekonomije. Njegova ključna dela preučujejo vpliv institucionalnih rigidnosti ter vpliv finančnih šokov na trg delovne sile. S svojim raziskovalnim delom pa je prispeval tudi k drugim znanstvenim publikacijam, sodeloval na številnih domačih in tujih konferencah ter bil direktor seminarjev na Joint Vienna Institute.

Simon Savšek graduated with honours from the School of Business and Economics in Ljubljana in 2009. After finishing his master's studies at the European University Institute in Florence, the Bank of Slovenia hired him as an economist in the Analysis and Research Department. At the same time, he also signed up for a PhD programme in economics at the School of Business and Economics. He was awarded PhD in 2019. Between October 2014 and September 2017, he worked at the European Central Bank, and afterwards joined the European Investment Bank, currently being Head of the EIB Group Office in Slovenia.

He published several research articles, including in international journals. His key research focuses on the impact of institutional rigidities and financial shocks on labour markets. He also contributed to several other scientific publications, including book chapters and presented at various national and international conferences. Dr. Savšek was also a Course Director at the Joint Vienna Institute.
